t 59, Maria already suffers from several health conditions that make it difficult for her to leave the house, and impossible to do it alone. She can't prepare a meal or visit the bathroom of her Ypsilanti home without risking a life-changing fall. She's grateful for help from her daughter, who serves as her caregiver, and for Ypsilanti Meals on Wheels, which provides her with food that she can't prepare on her own. But as she approaches her 60s, Maria worries about her future, especially as the country and her own community struggle to care for more seniors than ever before.

Maria wonders whether the help she needs will still be there as she ages, her daughter's life changes, and her own needs increase.

As Ypsilanti Meals on Wheels marks its 50th year of service to the community. we are determined to prepare not only for Maria, but for every neighbor who will need us in the years to come. While we celebrate the good we have already done, we are looking ahead to the work that will be required of us, and of the community.

Our Give More to Feed More Campaign is an ambitious effort to prepare for the "silver tsunami" on the horizon.

The campaign aims to raise enough capital to fund an additional one million meals over the next five years. This means raising an additional \$6 million, representing an overall growth of over 40% through 2028.

The success of this effort depends on all of us. It depends on seniors with few needs to reach out to those with many,

and for today's 40- and 50-year-olds to help us prepare for the needs they may have tomorrow
